San Secondo is an Italian town in the province of Parma, located in the Parma lowlands. In the 12th century, the Rossi family brought San Secondo to its maximum splendor and imposed the presence of this small territory in history. This country is famous for its historical monuments but above all for its gastronomy



The name of the town derives from a church that was built between the VIII-IX centuries on its territory and dedicated, in fact, to San Secondo d'Asti.

San Secondo was born in the Bronze Age from a social organization. The territory was colonized in Roman times and occupied in medieval times by barbarian populations. In the fourteenth century the territory was ceded by the Bishop of Parma to Giacomo Rossi. From 1438 to 1482, Pier Maria II conquered and organized a territory that goes from the Apennines to the Po, then recovered by the Milanese who annihilated the family. The following centuries saw the decline of the Rossi family which became extinct in 1825.



What can we visit?

- **ROCCA DEI ROSSI**

The fortress rises to the west of the village. The architectural complex, which originates from the fifteenth-century nucleus wanted by Pier Maria Rossi, during the sixteenth century was transformed into a stately monumental residence by Troilo I, Pier Maria III, Troilo II. Several artists organize in the rooms of the noble floor, an imposing pictorial cycle of a profane model for fairy tales, myths and history of the family. Disastrous nineteenth-century demolitions bring the structure to its present image.



- **CHURCH of BEATA VERGINE ANNUNCIATA**
Church of Beata Vergine Annunciata is a Catholic place of worship built in Baroque and Neoclassical style.
It was built in 1470 and was defined as a parish.
It underwent many renovations, which completely changed its appearance.



- **PIEVE of SAN GENESIO**
Pieve of San Genesio is a Romanesque-style church, located in the middle of a green area. It underwent many renovations, the last was in 1967 and the 13th-century structures were brought to light.




- **ANCIENT MUNICIPAL THEATER**
It was built in 1853 by some citizens of San Secondo to realize the inhabitants' wish for a public house.



The primary sector mainly concerns dairy production, the territory is in fact included in the production area of Parmigiano-Reggiano, there is no shortage of cereals, mainly corn and tomatoes are produced. Rice was also produced in the Tari Murto area until the 19th century.



Its secondary sector concerns the confectionery, oil and manufacturing industries, at an artisanal level there is a production of cured meats, especially the spalla. San Secondo is also part of the DOP production area of Culatello di Zibello.
